A little library growing each year is an honorable part of a town's history.

Our History

A charter group of members first met in 1979. Our Constitution and By-Laws were adopted in 1980. In 1999 the Friends were incorporated as a 501c(3) NH nonprofit corporation.

In the early years speakers presented programs on various topics at the Friends' monthly meetings. Donations were made to the library with funds raised from book sales, recycling, and the popular Library Lawn Sale, begun in 1980.

Currently business meetings are held five times a year. Each month Friends members volunteer at Second Hand Prose, our used book sale, which opened in 2002. The book sale now serves as our primary fundraiser supporting our activities and donations to the library throughout the year.
